Guest of honour at school reunion

Keith Rowe is not used to being famous. However, he will be the guest of honour at the 150th Cust School Jubilee on 10-12 November. At 99, he is definitely the oldest person attending the event, along with his brother Colin and sister Nancy at 90 and 93 years of age respectively. Keith remembers attending Cust School with his good mate Garth Wood, the butcher's boy. He tells stories of the two sneaking down to the Ashley River with fish and chips for lunch while out at manual classes in Rangiora.

He remembers a junior teacher fondly, "Miss Fairbrother I think her name was" but found the senior teacher a terror.

"I got the strap two or three times a day sometimes."

He would take the horse and cart to school from Terrace Road with his younger siblings. When the Cust River was high, the children would use the swing bridge while he drove the cart across, and recalls floating downstream on occasion. Keith says he was good at maths but a poor speller and left school at 12 to work on the farm as did many of his classmates.

The family moved around a bit, and Keith worked on various farms in the district, before working for Rangiora Transport. As an essential farm worker, he did not go to war but was part of the Home Guard in

Cust. Keith married Lilian Thompson in 1949 and had four children, then following her death in 1985, he married Valerie Smith. He has many grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, including those of his stepchildren

Around 65 years ago, the majority of the group were new entrants at the school while others joined the class at various times over the following nine years.

The group was thrilled to be joined by one of its popular teachers of 1958, Mr Ken Howarth, and his wife.

The reunion included a tour of the present day Oxford Area School and swapping of memories as they recalled their love of their new entrant teacher, Miss Miriam Watson, in the open-air classroom with its huge

bifolding doors and individual blackboards lining the walls.

Another teacher, Mr Russell Roberts, would have the students delivering notes to Miss Grace Shadbolt, the cooking teacher, who later became Mrs Roberts.

The headmaster, Mr Eric McClatchey, was one staff member who was as well avoided as his art of strapping pupils was well honed. All agreed that the abolishment of the strap and cane as forms of punishment was a big step in the right direction when educating children. Some also remembered the hard seated school buses owned by Johnson's Garage, where the seats ran lengthwise and every pothole was sorely endured.

The day finished with a meal at the Oxford Club in the evening, where not even the wonderful meals could stop the tongues wagging.

Oxford library assistant Hilary Mercer says the new building is comfortable and great to work in. "It's light and airy, and it's great to be in a purposebuilt library." The shift from the temporary library went smoothly and with a top-up of the current shelf stock, there

are now around 10,000 items on the shelves available for borrowing.



Give dairy goats a go

A field day held recently at Alice Jones' Cust farm was a great success.

Alice is the secretary of the Canterbury Dairy Goat Breeders Association and is keen to promote dairy goats.

Alice says that the main purpose of the field day was to promote the Canterbury club and share knowledge, especially with the hoof trimming as this a topic most asked about by people with goats. "We are looking at trying to hold at least four field days a year."

Goats have always been a big part of Alice's family. "They are all very friendly with great natures and very addictive," Alice laughs, "we now have over 40 goats at our stud (Hollybank)."

There is a saying in the goat community: "Goats are like potato chips, you can't have just one."

Commercial dairy goats are a relatively new concept in New Zealand. The idea was not developed in earnest until the 1980s, and now with a growing market for goat milk products the industry is taking off.

Goats' milk is used not just as food as in yoghurt, cheese, fudge, etc. but also to make beautiful creamy soap.

Goats are intelligent animals who quickly

They don't require shearing is a bonus, although care of their feet is necessary as they need trimming on a regular basis. Hoof trimming is just one of the skills taught at the field days.

Wind and rain proof shelters are a must and milking goats will need to be milked once a day - if shared with her kids.

They eat a good mix of pasture plants with

added hay in winter.

Goats are the ultimate escape artists so fencing must be up to scratch to contain these curious herbivores.

Workload for the Oxford Ambulance area has remained steady with 57 incidents in August and 56 incidents in September, bringing the number of incidents for 2017 to 407.

An increased workload throughout Canterbury has meant the Oxford ambulance team has been asked to respond outside the normal response area to Amberley for a patient having heart problems and into Porters Pass for a road traffic accident.

Coming across road traffic accidents can be challenging and stressful. Using the mnemonic DRSABC can help those first on scene to prioritise care:

- Dangers check for any danger to you, the patient, or bystanders, and make the area safe.
- Response check for response by asking a simple question and grasp/squeeze the shoulders.
- Send for help call for an ambulance (dial 111) or send someone else to call.
- Airway open the airway by tilting the head back, lifting the chin, clear the mouth and check for breathing.
- **Bleeding** control by putting pressure on the wound with your hand and/or medical dressing.
- CPR perform chest compressions and breaths if the person is not responding or breathing, apply an AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillator) if available.

In Oxford and surrounding areas community AEDs are located at the Lees Valley community hall, Ashley George Holiday Park, Oxford Working Men's Club, Oxford Fresh Choice super market, Coopers Creek Hall, Cust Service Station and West Eyreton Hall.

We are continually recruiting ambulance officers, if you would like information, call the Oxford station on 033123516.

The ambulance station is not manned 24 hours a day, for medical emergencies or medical advice please call 111.

Oxford Museum News

According to an article in the Oxford Museum's archives, the town has had a library for nearly 150 years.

A meeting in 1868 led to the building of a Mechanics' Institute on the south-east corner of Bay Rd and Church St.

This provided a reading room and library for the next 20 years, then the books were moved to the Orange Lodge on the corner of Main St and Park Ave. By 1893, a new library was built in Pearson Park. Eventually it was replaced by the council office and library built to mark the Canterbury Centennial in 1950 and is now being used as a craft shop and community trust headquarters.

The next move was to the Council Service Centre in a former stock agency building on the corner of Main and Burnett Sts.

While this was being replaced recently, the library moved temporarily to the pavilion in the showgrounds, but is now back on Main St in a new purpose-built facility.

The Oxford Museum is open every Sunday from 11am-4pm and 1-3.30pm every Wednesday and Saturday.


Guy Fawkes distressing for pets

With Tracie Miller **BROWN SPOTS & FRECKLES**

Freckles are small flat brown marks arising on the face and other sun-exposed areas. They are most often seen in fair-skinned people, especially those with red hair, but they are an inherited characteristic. As the person ages, this type of freckle generally become less noticeable. Apart from sun protection, no particular treatment is necessary.

Age spot is the common name for a lentigine. This is a brownish area of skin discolouration, generally on the face, arms and legs, caused by the sun damaging fair skin. Age spots are similar to large freckles, which are also caused by the sun. As we age our body is less able to absorb the ultraviolet rays that damage our skin and this causes the areas of darker pigmentation or melanin to occur more frequently as we get older. It is probably more correct to call these marks sunspots rather than age spots, as they reflect damage over time from the sun, rather than just the passing of the years.

If the brown marks are scaly, they may be actinic keratoses (sun damage) or seborrhoeic keratoses (senile warts). Facial pigmentation may also be due to melasma, a chronic pigmentary disorder.

Most sunspots can be prevented by regular, daily use of sunscreen to all exposed skin, but staying out of the sun and using sun protective clothing is much more effective than sunscreens alone.

Treat or lightened sunspots by laser or careful use of skin bleaching preparations. Both can damage the skin so must be used carefully, as advised by your doctor or dermatologist.

It is important to have your skin checked as soon as you notice any new areas of pigmented skin. Consult your community pharmacist, who will advise you if you can wait until your next scheduled visit to your doctor or if you need to get it checked immediately.
